Prevention





Wash your hands well and often to avoid contamination

Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or sleeve when coughing or sneezing and discard used tissue

Avoid

Avoid Clean touching eyes, nose, or mouth with frequently touched unwashed hands objects and surfaces As a driver, you may have to travel to different farms / sites across the region and interact with the general public.

Strathroy Dairy's Management Team are constantly monitoring the status of the outbreak based on reputable sources of information including the <u>HSC</u>, the <u>HSE</u> and <u>HPSC</u> websites.

Precautions to prevent or limit the spread of COVID-19 include:

- Carry and use a personal bottle of alcohol based hand rub with you as hand wash facilities may not be available;
- Carry and use tissues for sneezing/ coughing;
- Dispose of tissues using a designated disposal bag;
- Use a disinfectant to regularly wipe down surfaces inside your vehicle;
- Avoid physical interactions such as shaking hands and maintain a safe distance of at least 1 metre.
- At the weighbridge, reduce social interaction. Only 1 person at a time in the office
- At the testing lab, stay in your cab, wait for the sample to be taken by Strathroy staff, and move forward to intake area
- At intake area and CIP station, limit social interaction with other drivers and Strathroy staff to a minimum
